The goal of this course is to write, reflect, and discuss topics that relate to you as an individual, and to the world around you. We will accomplish this by using your Language Arts Concepts (Ethics, Perspective, Change, Identity, Power, and Awareness) to construct successful writing pieces.

We will be writing in a variety of forms in order to get your minds and pencils moving! We will work on spelling, grammar, vocabulary, and the writing process in general to ensure you are able to effectively communicate your thoughts and arguments on paper.

In order to establish a successful, safe, and engaged community, everyone will be responsible for participating in class by sharing his or her personal experiences, questions, thoughts, and ideas; remember, you have important knowledge to share with others! Together as a community of learners, we will maintain an environment founded on respect, diligence, and enthusiasm.

## Handing in Work

#### Formatting

All student work must be handed in on time with the following heading in the top left-hand corner:

student's name date period name of assignment



#### Late Work

If a student chooses to hand in a **large writing task** after it is due, the student will receive 3 percent off each day it is late. Once the grade has depleted to 0, the student will be unable to make up the work. **Small writing tasks** will be deducted 50 percent one day past the deadline, and will be worth a 0 after that. I am gracious about extensions, so long as the student sees me <u>at least 24 hours in advance</u>.

#### Absentee Work

If a student has an excused absence from class, then he or she has the same number of days missed to make up the assignment. If absentee work is not made up within this time frame, I will assess the assignment based on late work penalties (above). Students are required to independently seek out what they've missed outside of our class time (i.e., before or after school, STAR, lunch, etc.)

## Grading System

- **50%** large writing tasks (final, published pieces)
- **30%** small writing tasks (drafts, notebook entries, etc.)

20% class participation and preparedness (i.e., entrance/exit tickets, conferences, preparation of materials, etc.)



### Extra Help

Everyone has the opportunity to get a great grade in Writing Workshop this year. I encourage all students to seek me out for extra help at any point necessary. I am usually in my classroom after school. However, please let me know in advance if you would like to meet so that I can be sure I am available.

Can't stay after school? I check my email frequently, so please feel free to send me any questions and/or concerns regarding assignments. I will always give credit to those who put extra effort into their work.

### Classroom Procedures

**Entrance/Exit Tickets** 

Students will be presented with a daily Entrance Ticket upon entering the classroom with the intention of jumpstarting each day's agenda and objective. Additionally, when necessary, I will assign an Exit Ticket at the period's end in order to assess students' understanding and mastery of the day's lesson.

#### Mini Lessons

Mini Lessons will be conducted each week and will be centered on various important writing elements needed for students to complete the task on which they are working.

For example, if we are working on writing a persuasive letter and I feel that students would benefit from further clarification on applying thesis statements, I will hold a mini lesson. Mini Lessons will either include the entire class or small groups, depending on student needs.

#### Writer's Notebook

Students will maintain a Writer's Notebook throughout the duration of the course. All prewriting exercises and small writing assignments will be kept in this notebook.
